




















Immigrants helping elderly residents

- Emmaus Association in Åland started a pool of workers in early 2016
- Primarily immigrants helping elderly residents in the countryside (80%)
- Small tasks that are not interesting for entrepreneurs and that the customers otherwise would not get help with
- Emmaus functions as the formal employer, non-profit
- Way of helping the workers to get good references and making rural living easier for elderly residents


