- Facilitates Nordic-European comparisons




Collaboration between researchers and practitioners

- Joint working developing policy tools and recommendations



Regions and sectors as categories

- Regions are not contained within administrative borders
- But administrative regions are important from a policy perspective
- Sectors as a way in to the research
- Cross-sectoral or platform activities increasingly relevant

- Knowledge exchange, networks and interactions between different actors from a spatial perspective
- Fabric of networks
- Not restricted to the region, but multi scalar
- Example from Oulu South presented by Eija-Riitta Niinikoski & Harri Jokela






Firm level knowledge dynamics


- How knowledge is developed and transferred at a micro level
