- People/residents/citizens as the pivot point for urban research










Holistic Urbanism?

- An interdisciplinary concept that identifies people as the central element of the city
- Aims to overcome the barriers between conventional citymaking disciplines
 - Urban planning, architecture and engineering
 - Recognizes economic development, social issues and technology
- Accounts for a diversity elements that influence and interact at the neighbourhood, district, city and regional scales.
- All urban dwellers, regardless of age, ethnicity, employment or orientation, have knowledge and skills that contribute to citymaking
 - The disciplines mentioned above are seen as an inclusive point of departure for holistic urbanism rather than strictly defining the concept.



Sustainable Urban Metabolisms for Europe


- Exploring how urban development in cities across Europe will influence resource efficiency

 European cities with distinct contexts






Sustainable Urban Metabolisms for Europe

- Project also zoomed into the neighbourhood scale
- Looked at the potential impacts of "sustainable" projects in select cities
- Underlines how different scales influence one another and contribute to wider outcomes





Territorial Approaches for New Governance – ESPON TANGO

- Exploring the ways in which a diversity of actors contribute to the development of their territory within their contextually specific legal and political settings
 - Governments, private actors, grass roots organizations, media & the public
- Included a case study on resource efficiency in Stockholm & SRS
 - Multi-scalar

- What are defining characteristics of poverty & social exclusion? How contextually specific are they?
- What are the challenges and good practices that are evident in Stockholm?



Territorial Indicators of Poverty & Social Exclusion – ESPON TIPSE

- Inclusion & exclusion are influenced by policies from all levels of government
- Clear evidence in Stockholm of the combined influences of economics, social issues, mobility & built form



Digital Platforms for Citizen Engagement

- Scoping the potentials for public engagement using digital technology
- Identify trends, strengths and issues with such approaches
- Augment, rather than replace, engagement IRL
- Highlighting the value of "soft" approaches to the Smart City

- "Green Building": Buildings, Urban Systems & Governance
- Promoting knowledge exchanges





Interreg REGREEN


- Deeper understanding of how municipalities from across Europe operate
- Rich opportunity to identify good practices & apply them in new settings







