13.45-15.00 (Seminar day 1) Innovative green solutions for regions and businesses. Held inside FENNIA II and in the Foyer just outside, see separate map.



WHAT TO DO IN HELSINKI?


Sauna experience and a dip in the sea

The Allas Sea Pool, opened in September and located by the Market square, 100m from Marina Congress Center, is built on a valuable location, on the shore of the Baltic Sea. The sustainable use of the waterfront is an important issue and they follow cleantech ideology. The Allas Sea Pool's floating deck has a large fresh water pool (27 degrees) and the sea water pool (1,5 degrees). Pools and saunas (separate for men and women) are open MON-THU 6:30 a.m. - 9 p.m. and tickets are 9 euros.



Sightseeing and shopping

The neighbourhood next to Marina Congress Center and Hotel Grand Marina is full of history, and full of sights: Cathedral of Uspenski (in the photo), "the big white church" The Helsinki Cathedral by the Senat square, the Presidential palace etc, all just 5 min walk away. Around the Senat square you will find lots of handicraft stores but also Finnish design and modern brand stores. Esplanad parc is also full of shops and Finnish brands, and within 10 min walk.



Food & drinks closeby

Take a walk around historical district and street: Kanavanranta, next to the Uspenski Cathedral, and find Johan & Nyström cafe, restaurant Sipuli and Bar Holiday. By the Senat square, street called Aleksanterinkatu, you will find the famous old cafe Engel, named after the architect who designed many Empire style buildings around the Senate Square including The Dome of Helsinki, The University Hall and The University Library. The street is full of places as it is the main street of Helsinki.
